

The Adams County Board of Commissioners met September 7, 2021 at 10:00 a.m. in the Adams County Service Complex. Present were Commissioners: Rex Moore, Stan Stoppenhagen, and Steve Kuhn; HR Coordinator Shannon Greene, Auditor, Tony Mellencamp, and County Attorney, Mark Burry.

IN RE: MINUTES

Upon a motion by Stan Stoppenhagen and seconded by Steve Kuhn, for approval by the County Board of Commissioners' Minutes for August 31, 2021. Motion carried.

IN RE: AUDITOR REPORT

Worker's Comp. Claims

Upon a motion by Stan Stoppenhagen and second by Steve Kuhn to approve the Workmen's Comp Audit claims for August in the amount of \$21,614.00. Motion Carried.

IN RE: HIGHWAY

Adams County Highway Department Superintendent, Brad Yoder, opened sealed bids for a one-ton dump truck. Upon a motion by Steve Kuhn and second by Stan Stoppenhagen to take the bid of \$58,741.00 from Moser Motor Sales under advisement. Motion Carried. Assistant Superintendent, Paul Zerby, noted there were no bids from GM due to the fact they are not accepting orders currently due to shortages for parts. Ford Motor Company is still accepting orders for government units but they weren't sure of a timeline for receiving the truck once ordered.

Sealed bids were also for a tandem axle chassis were also opened. Selking had a bid for a 2023 International with a \$13,500 trade allowance for \$120,799.42. Stoops Freightliner had 3 separate bids. The first was for a 2023 Freightliner with a Cummins engine for \$114,600.00 with a trade-in allowance of \$18,000. The next was a bid for a 2023 Western Star for \$123,500.00 with an \$18,000 trade-in allowance. The final Stoops bid was a 2023 Freightliner with a Detroit motor for \$113,303.00 with a trade-in allowance of \$18,000.

Upon a motion by Stan Stoppenhagen and second by Steve Kuhn to take the bids under advisement. Motion Carried.

IN RE BUILDING AND GROUNDS

Rick Burkhalter, Building and Grounds Director, reported to the Commissioner's updates on work his department has been doing in all of the buildings and that he is still waiting to hear back on an update concerning the bids going out for two new chillers.

IN RE: TREASURER

Upon a motion by Steve Kuhn and second by Stan Stoppenhagen to approve a grant submitted by EMA Director, John August in the amount of \$18,000 for an EMPG Competitive Grant. Motion Carried.

Upon a motion by Steve Kuhn and second by Stan Stoppenhagen to approve the EMPG Performance Grant in the amount of \$35,264.06. Motion carried.

Upon a motion by Steve Kuhn and second by Stan Stoppenhagen to approve three other grants through LEPC for 2022. Motion Carried.

These will all go before the Adams County Council at its next meeting, for its approval.

Adams County Attorney Mark Burry had nothing to present to the Commissioners.


IN RE: ADJOURNMENT

Upon a motion by Steve Kuhn and second by Stan Stoppenhagen to adjourn. Motion Carried.


