IN RE: MINUTES

Upon a motion by Rex Moore and seconded by Steve Kuhn, for approval by the County Board of Commissioners' Minutes for July 26, 2022. Motion Carried.

Payroll Claims

Upon a motion by Rex Moore and second by Steve Kuhn to adjourn. Motion Carried.


