IN RE: MINUTES

IN RE: OTHER MATTERS PROPERLY PRESENTED

Todd Jennings, Indiana Department of Transportation, reported to the Commissioners regarding the 5311 Program and potential expansion for county transit. Federal Rural Transit Funds entails the 5311 funds. This involves rural public transportation formula grants for operating assistance with rural populations of less than 50,000. This is a 50% local match requirement. The matter was taken under advisement. This transit would be done through the Adams County Council on Aging as a non-profit corporation.

Adams County Prosecutor, Jeremy Brown, sought to take the investigator position away and make a current part-time position full-time. Cleveland Ing resigned from the investigator position earlier this year. The investigator position had gone from part-time to full-time in past years. If this is approved it would be a net gain revenue wise. The secretary position would go to full time and the investigator position would be budgeted at zero. The matter was taken under advisement.




County Attorney, Mark Burry, reported that he is still working on several issues that will be coming up in the next few weeks.
